As a responsible corporate citizen, Terumo is contributing to society by focusing on the following activities: –

1. Promoting- education including special education and employment enhancing vocational skills.
2. Promoting healthcare including preventive healthcare.

The key initiatives in which Terumo has been engaged are as follows:

#### **Terumo Scholarship Programme-**

Being one of the largest cardiac surgery solution provider, Terumo believes in skill building activities that improve clinical outcomes in cardiopulmonary bypass. Within Cardiac Surgery team, Clinical Perfusionist is an important allied health professional responsible for maintaining adequate perfusion during cardiac surgery procedure.

Terumo Scholarship Programme has been developed with a focus to promote education and employment enhancement skills amongst students opting for Clinical Perfusion course. The programme has been launched in collaboration with NarayanaHrudayalaya Foundation to provide scholarship to deserving students belonging to under-privileged section in order to pursue B.Sc. Perfusion Technology Programme.

During FY'16, 10 students who have scored more than 70% in Higher Secondary Examination with under-privileged section were selected for scholarship. The Formal launch event was held at NarayanaHrudayalaya Foundation and scholarship of Rs 50,000/- each were handed over to 10 students.

#### **Congenital Heart Disease Programme**

Cardiovascular disease has become the leading cause of morbidity and mortality in India during the last three decades. Within cardiovascular diseases, Congenital Heart Disease (CHD) is a leading cause of birth defect-associated infant illness and death in India, where-in 3/1000 live births require early surgery and 13/1000 require surgery later in childhood.

As part of our CSR commitment, Terumo India Pvt Ltd, provides support to CHD program and help children diagnosed with CHD requiring surgical correction, through screening camps, surgeries in tertiary care cardiac centers and post-op follow-up.

Terumo has collaborated with NGO, Aishwarya Trust, based out of Bangalore, to conduct 1) Pre-screening camps in order to identify children's suffering from CHD and 2) Support children diagnosed with CHD for surgical correction.

Terumo Associates voluntarily participate in the pre-screening camps and help the primary health care staff and team in organizing registration desk. In order to create awareness of the CHD among the people Terumo Associates are distributing patient education booklet on CHD at the camps.

Till date, 3 pre-screening camps have been conducted, wherein total 37 children were identified and 8 surgeries were supported by TIPL.

### **Going Ahead**

Since most of these projects are executed in a dynamic environment, encompassing various stakeholders, we have not disbursed funds on projects just to achieve the target. Terumo is of the opinion that CSR funds will be spent on projects which are 'sustainable' or delivering effective 'results' to the society.

Being a 4 year old subsidiary, though our CSR scale is smaller than our desire, but we have plans to build it larger soon as our organization moves ahead.
